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Dear Parents/Guardians of current 4th grade students:

Each year around this time, we usually begin reaching out to 4th grade families who will be part of the Frederick School community next year. As the current school year starts to wind down, we are actively working on our planning for the 2026-2027 school year.

We are very excited to welcome your child to Frederick! We understand that the transition to Frederick School can bring about a lot of excitement as well as questions. We wanted to share a few things with all families to help everyone feel more prepared, even before the current school year ends.

Class Building

Class building is one of our most important tasks in our planning process. Our goal is to place students in the best possible learning environment. We try to build classes that are balanced in terms of learning needs, styles, emotional and social development, academic achievement, and behavior.

We welcome parent involvement in this process, as we recognize that parents know their children better than anyone else. Because it is very difficult to grant requests for specific teachers, we ask that your input focus on your child's learning style, significant learning experiences, and/or the type of teaching style to which your child responds best.

We will use this information, along with input from teachers, to place your child in a classroom that will best meet his or her needs. We ask that all parent feedback is submitted through the form linked above by **Friday, May 8th**.

Student Orientation

Later this month, fourth grade students will get a chance to tour Frederick School and learn about the school. The schedule for these visits is as follows:

Monday, April 27th: Prairieview

Tuesday, April 28th: Woodview

Wednesday, April 29th: Meadowview

Thursday, April 30th: Avon

Each tour session will take place during the morning of the designated day, and all students will be transported to and from Frederick by bus from their current school. Each orientation setting will last approximately one hour.

New Parent Orientation

We have also scheduled two new parent orientation sessions to help all parents/guardians get more acclimated to Frederick School. There will be **two different session times on Wednesday, May 6th**. The same content will be covered in each orientation session, and you are welcome to choose whatever time works best in your schedule.

The New Parent Orientation sessions will take place on **Wednesday, May 6th** at the following times:

Morning Session: 9:30 - 10:15am

Evening Session: 6:30 - 7:15pm

Sessions will begin in the Frederick School multipurpose room, which is adjacent to our main entrance. Sessions will include an introduction to our administrative team, a presentation providing an overview of Frederick School and will include a brief building tour.

Kick-Off Camp

Mark your calendars! Our annual Kick-Off Camp will be held on **Wednesday, August 12th!** The camp is designed to offer our incoming 5th graders a chance to come into the school and learn skills and procedures that will help them be successful at Frederick School through a variety of fun and collaborative activities. They also get a chance to meet some of the students and staff they will be interacting with over the next two years. Information on how to register will be coming soon! There is a \$10.00 for Kick-Off Camp that will also include a special t-shirt so all participants will get their first piece of Frederick spirit wear!

Please Note: Frederick School is scheduled to have extensive construction this summer to update our Media Center, STEM lab and create a Maker Space. While construction is expected to be completed the week prior to Kick-Off Camp, delays in any large project are always a possibility. Safety is always our top priority, so delays could impact our ability to have students or staff in the building. If this occurs, the event may be cancelled. We are also exploring other possibilities to offer a revised version of the event as well, but we wanted everyone to be aware of the possibility. We will make sure to communicate with all families closer to the event to share any changes of our plans. If the event is cancelled completely, we will make sure all fees that were paid can be refunded. Thank you for your understanding!
